(AP) — School performance data released today by the North Carolina State Board of Education shows that Charlotte-Mecklenburg Schools' all reading and math composite scores increased, including improvements in third grade literacy and high school Math I. The data also showed 58% of schools earned a School Performance Grade of an A, B or C.
